Trade Union stalwart, Henk Smith, has hung up boots after forty-three (43) of being a unionist. Smith was born in Bellville, Cape Town and his family relocated to his grandparents' farm in Touws River.

Soon after matriculating, Smith entered the job market as a Transnet Train Assistant in 1980 and this was when the union bug bit him and he enrolled as a Voetplaat Union member.

When the Spoornet started the restructuring, unfortunately, Touws River was affected and several depots closed-

but as luck would have it, Smith was one of the employees transferred to Worcester.

"In 1995 I was appointed as Train Driver in Worcester and I was then elected as the Branch Chairperson for Worcester with a total membership of 4 members. Over the next 3 years I grew the Worcester branch to a point where it had more members than the Kimberley branch," he said.

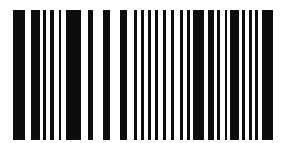
Smith's hard work and efforts were recognised by the Union at the Congress in 1996.

While this was momentous for Smith, surprisingly it has not been the highlight of his career but the pinnacle of his career was winning his first arbitration when he represented three members who were unfairly dismissed by Transnet Engineering in Salt River.

"Three of our members were unfairly dismissed, they were brought back and they were retrospectively compensated," he said.

One of Smith's highlights was being given the chance to attend an ER course in Turin, Italy's capital city.

"During the course, you meet up with all TURs and managers from all over the world. It also showed me that the training that UNTU gave to its TURs or FTURs is excellent in relation to all the other countries that had attended the training, as members we should be proud of how UNTU equips us as TURs," Smith added.

While Smith says he hasn't considered what this next chapter holds, however, he says he will focus on his wife, Magriet, who has selflessly allowed him to do what he loves for the last 14 years which is to serve UNTU members by going beyond the call of duty.

"I believe it is time to take her to those places she wants to see that I have told her about during my time with UNTU and Transnet," he said.

Smith says what he will miss the most about being part of UNTU is the daily interaction with members, whose diversity have always presented him with an opportunity to learn.

"What I will miss the most is the daily interaction with our members, to experiencing their gratitude when you have assisted them, I believe it is also the diversity and the opportunity to learn from them all, there was never a dull moment, each day brought its own ups and downs," he said.

Smith's advice to the remaining UNTU leadership emphasizes the importance of putting members of the union first.

"You are not the Union, our Union consists of our membership they are the members that have elected you, earn their trust and be worthy of their trust," he said.

Smith's last parting words to the rest of UNTU embody the type of leadership he has shown over the span of his career.

"Lastly, I want to thank each and every member of UNTU, every employee at UNTU Head office, Cape Town office, Port Elizabeth and in Durban. Thank you for your willingness to always assist," he added

UNTU wishes Oom Henk a long and blissful retirement with his wife and loved ones.

LUTWENA SAUL RETURNS TO HER SEAT IN UNTU'S EXECUTIVE COUNCIL:

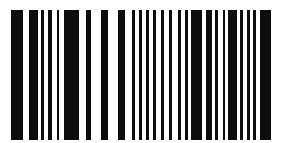


Lutwena Saul has recently returned to the UNTU Executive Council with renewed energy, a wealth of experience, and a plan to drive the Union forward.

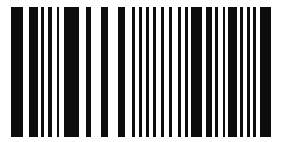

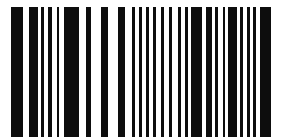

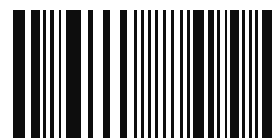

UNTU members qualify for the Discretionary fund Benefit of R6000 payable when an UNTU member retires. This benefit is only payable on Statutory retirement age (age 63 years)

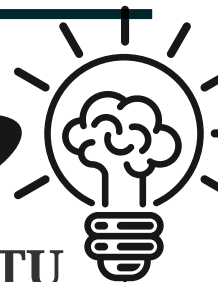
N.B. To qualify for the above benefit a member must have had 5 years of continuous union membership with UNTU. Should a member resign and rejoin, his benefit is penalized by 25%.

REAP THE BENEFITS

The United National Transport Union provides a range of free benefits to its members. All UNTU members are eligible for primary benefits e.g. representation at Dispute Resolution Processes and wage negotiations and secondary benefits like our Death Benefit (explained on our Benefits Wheel). Members can access an extensive range of benefits by paying a minimum of R53.00 to a maximum of R88.00.

Additionally, UNTU rewards members for successful recruitment by providing R100 for each Stop Order.

Collective Bargaining

Representation in collective bargaining, disciplinary proceedings and legal representation as determined by the Management Committee.

Holiday Discounts

10% on holiday bookings made on Gomelo.co.za subject to availability. T&Cs apply. Discounted holiday prices at The Palms Voetplaak Park (formerly UNTU Palms).

Death Benefit & Funeral Cover

UNTU pays out R1 000 to R10 000 to a member's nominee, spouse or estate. This benefit covers a member's spouse, children and stillborn babies. UNTU offers members an extended voluntary funeral cover at discounted rates.

Maternity Benefit

UNTU female members receive R1 800 once-off after the birth of their child. (After 12 months' membership).

Discretionary Fund

This fund pays out R6 000 to members who go on statutory retirement. This fund is applicable to members who have been with the union for five or more continuous years.
