The UNTU Leader emphasized that he wants to see the transformation on all fronts of the organisation and Labour environment, including seeing more women contesting more leadership positions.

The United National Transport Union (UNTU) President, Steven Leshabana says his first year in office started with turbulence, but he says those are the same challenges that have shaped him into a better leader.

Leshabana was elected as UNTU President during the Special Congress in June last year in the middle of the Transnet wage negotiations with a strike looming and a court battle in the Labour Court between the UNTU and the Passenger Rail Agency of South Africa (PRASA) after it failed to honor the 2020 salary/wage agreement. UNTU President says he isn't one to shy away from challenges. As the leader of the organization, he met these challenges

Amid all the challenges facing UNTU, Leshabana has kept his eye on the ball as he surpassed his first goal of meeting 90% of UNTU Shop Stewards and Branches. These dialogues have been the highlight of his term in office so far.

UNTU VICE-PRESIDENT BELIEVES IN LEADING WITH THE HEART

The United National Transport Union (UNTU) Vice-President, Wielligh Meyer, comes from humble beginnings as a General contract worker at Transnet's Big Steel Foundry in 1999. It is this humble beginning that has shaped UNTU's Vice-President into the kind of leader he is today.

Meyer was born and bred in Pretoria and started his career as a General contract worker at Transnet, following in his father's footsteps, who retired at Transnet after 45 years of service.

Meyer, says that when he started working his father gave him two pieces of advice.

"First, get medical aid and secondly, you must belong to a Labour Union. That is your insurance", he said.

He says because he was a contract worker at the time, he didn't have the privilege of having medical aid, but he took his father's second piece advice and joined UTATU SARWHU, which later became UNTU. It was this decision that saved him when Transnet began talks of closing the Steel Foundry.

"Meyer says when talks began of closing the Steel Foundry, contract workers became the first casualties of this process. He says he was out of a job for nearly two months but was lucky enough to be called back to work at Transnet.

"I took this opportunity with both hands. This time I worked at the actual Foundry, which was quite labor-intensive. We would work from 6 am to 6 pm," he added.

Meyer says when talks about Steel Foundry closing re-emerged, he knew that it was time to look for other opportunities within Transnet. He was able to secure a position as a General Worker within the Transnet wheels business.

Although his career at Transnet was filled with adversities, Meyer says he never lost his voice and continued to be outspoken against injustices within the workplace.

His hard work and passion didn't go unnoticed and a new Operations Manager at the time allowed him to take an ultrasonic testing course, a scarce skill within Transnet.

"I had no cooking clue what that was, but I went for it, and there was a load of mathematics involved which, I am not good at, but I passed," Meyer added.

Impressed by his results, the Transnet Ops Manager sent Meyer to more non-destructive testing processes which ultimately led to his promotion.

His co-workers also saw leadership qualities in Meyer, and he was elected as a Trade Union Representative(TUR) in 2002. He remained a TUR however, due to his passion for constantly learning, he took a sabbatical between 2006-2009 to obtain his Trade as an Artisan.

His leadership skills left a mark on his co-workers, and he was elected again as a TUR upon his return. In 2013 he was elected as a Branch Secretary and in 2015 he was elected as a UNTU Executive Councill member (Exco).

Meyer was re-elected as a UNTU Exco member at UNTU's Special Congress in 2022 and was elected as UNTU's Deputy Vice-President in February 2023 which he says is an honor to

"I was extremely honored when I was elected as Vice-President in February 2023 by the Executive Council after the retirement of Trevor Wasserfall. I had to hit the ground running with everything happening within Transnet and PRASA including privatisation talks. I am extremely blessed to have the constant support of the Executive Council and UNTU staff," Meyer

Meyer says what has been a highlight of his career in leadership positions is the ability to change someone's life for the better, whether it is through winning hard cases for UNTU members or sharing advice with Full Time Union should be open to being led. "What is very important to me is that we should not go in with a mindset that we know all, we we need to humble ourselves, sit down and forget about titles. Sometimes you will be surprised from where you get the most important advice and it might come from a member," Meyer added.

NEW UNTU EXECUTIVE COUNCILLOR, LEON SITHOLE, IS READY TO HIT THE GROUND RUNNING.

The newly elected United National Transport Union(UNTU) Executive Councillor, Leon Sithole (39), says anti-apartheid activism paved the way for him to easily transition into fighting against the injustices facing workers in the workplace.

"I have always been a vocal person; I have always been brave and opinionated, and my confidence grew when the members said maybe this gentleman could speak for us. I was that person which they could trust when it comes to standing up for what is right. I would do so without hesitation," he said.

Sithole says through the mentorship of a Shop Steward at the time, who took him under his wing and showed him the ropes, it wasn't long until he was elected as an UNTU Full-time Union Representative. Sithole was elected as an UNTU Executive Councillor, in February 2023.

Sithole has hit the ground running as his election has come at a time when Labour is fighting external forces that seek to privatise State-Owned Entities, which he says is a direct attack on workers and Organised Labour. Sithole says he is ready to put up a fight to protect UNTU members and the workforce at large.

Khumalo says this additional qualification will ensure that UNTU becomes a global giant in labour matters.



PRASA 2020 SALARY/WAGE AGREEMENT. WRIT OF EXECUTION

UNTU's long drawn-out legal battle secures a win for ALL PRASA employees

The United National Transport Union's relentless fight to ensure that PRASA honours the 2nd and 3rd years of the 2020 salary/wage agreement led to victory after employees received a lump sum payment in May and PRASA agreed to a payment plan that will ensure that the monies for the 2nd year of the agreement is paid in full by end of December 2023 and the 3rd year payments are completed by November 2024.

Fighting injustices affecting workers has always and will always remain UNTU's priority and while the Labour Court ruled that PRASA must only pay UNTU members, our long-drawn-out legal battle benefitted all employees who have been financially constrained over the two years PRASA failed to implement the wage increases.

UNTU is aware that PRASA's history counts against it and the entity has negotiated in bad faith in the past, therefore UNTU will not abandon the writ of execution until every single cent owed to members s is paid. VIVA UNTU VIVA!



UNTU FORMS PART OF DISCUSSIONS WITH PRESIDENT CYRIL RAMAPHOSA ON CHALLENGES FACING STATE-OWNED ENTERPRISES.

The United National Transport Union (UNTU) formed part of an organised Labour delegation invited to meet with President, Cyril Ramaphosa to provide input on the challenges facing State-Owned Enterprises, mainly Transnet and PRASA Public Enterprises Minister, Pravin Gordhan, and Transport Minister, Sindiswa Chikunga also formed part of the meeting held on 12 April 2023.

UNTU highlighted that it remains against Private Sector Partnerships at Transnet and other SOEs Transnet Management and Government have played a role in the deterioration of these entities, the fraud and corruption that took place under the watch of the current Government and the Transnet and Prasa management teams, the loans to cover up inefficiencies and losses, the 1064 scandal is but a few of these examples UNTU will continue fighting against the privatisation of SOEs




UNTU DEATH BENEFIT

UNTU SECURES A WIN AFTER A FIVE-YEAR DISCIPLINARY PROCESS

The United National Transport Union (UNTU) prides itself in fighting against the injustices facing our members in the workplace. UNTU represents members in all labour disputes ranging from disciplinary hearings and legal cases that end up in the Labour Court.

After five years, UNTU secured a win for our member and Transnet. employee, Mr. VV Scheepers. Transnet failed to appoint Scheepers as an Operator: Lifting Equipment even after he was recommended candidate and had obtained the highest score during the selection process.

Mr. Scheepers was presented by UNTU Deputy General Secretary, Neels Haasbroek whose determination and passion to fight for workers within the workplace led to a victory.

The Transnet Bargaining Council found the failure to appoint Scheepers to the position of Operations Co-ordinator constituted an unfair labour practice.

Transnet was ordered to appoint Mr. Scheepers as a post-Operations Co-ordinator, a G-level supervisory position alternatively if this post isn't available then he must be granted a promotion to Operations Coordinator and he must be paid a remuneration payable to the incumbent of


